Traveling Chocobo treatment ladder

TREATMENT	WHERE IT APPEARS	PRACTICAL MEANING
Borderless nonfoil or foil	Play and Collector Boosters	The accessible character-art lane
Neon ink colors	Collector Boosters	Choose one finish or a defined color set
Black neon ink	Japanese-language card	Verify language and collector number
Serialized gold	77 English Collector Booster copies	Extreme scarcity; never a normal completion target

Single, sealed or walk away

1. Buy the single

Use this route when the exact card, finish or character is the goal.
2. Open sealed product

Use this route when Draft, discovery or the premium opening itself is worth the cost.
3. Walk away

Stop when the image, collector number, finish, language, condition or seller evidence is unclear.

Condition and storage before checkout

- ☐ Match front and back — Confirm collector number, set code, finish and language.
- ☐ Inspect the object — Check centering, corners, edge whitening, surface scratches and foil curvature.
- ☐ Choose the right home — Use sleeves for active decks, side-loading binders for browsing, and rigid protection for high-value singles.
- ☐ Control the room — Avoid garages, attics, parked cars, moisture swings and folded playmats.
