The block icon check

1. Find the printed block icon

Do not infer legality from release date or character.
2. Confirm the event regulation

The organizer names Standard, Extra, or another format.
3. Check restrictions

Review the current banned and restricted card notice.
4. Save the list

Keep the version you intend to register and bring.

First three games

- ☐ Game 1 — Learn turn flow and DON!! use.
- ☐ Game 2 — Name the leader plan and the cards that serve it.
- ☐ Game 3 — Record one repeated failure; upgrade only that failure.

Low-waste buying order

- ☐ One current starter deck — Choose the plan you want to repeat.
- ☐ Licensed protection — Opaque sleeves, an official fitted deck box, and matching spares.
- ☐ Three stock games — Buy singles for a named problem; boosters remain entertainment.
